Body aches/chills


Cough/Diarrhea

- Person to person transmission
- High-touch surfaces

 Isolation of 10 days is required for those who are symptomatic and/or test positive





 Quarantine is for those who are not ill but have been exposed





- Community sites and pharmacies
- Urgent cares and hospitals







 Antibody testing can be done to identify if a person had previously contracted COVID-19





No vaccine or antiviral medication is available







 Need to determine what works for your individual locations and also what is considered safe














 Place sanitizer dispensers in areas where they can easily be seen by everyone

 Everyone must get on board and be a part of the solution






 Employees must have their nose, mouth and chin covered.

- An attendant can "serve" or portion these foods for students






Gloves are necessary for touching ready to eat food

 Whenever possible, pre-bag or pre-package food items for efficient and sanitary dissemination to customers













